## Happy & Healthy Hints from the AWCC Kitchen Tamara's Gingerbread Recipe

- 125g Butter, Softened
- 1/2 Cup Brown Sugar
- 1/2 Cup Golden Syrup
- 2 1/2 Cups Plain Flour, Sifted
- 1 Teaspoon Bi-Carb
- 1 teaspoon Ground Ginger

- 1. Beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
- 2. Add golden syrup, flour, bi-carb soda and ginger.
- 3. Mix to form a smooth dough.
- 4. Refrigerate for 10 mins
- 5. Roll between sheets of baking paper.
- 6. Bake for 10 mins in 190 oven or until golden.

Junior Kindy Update

Transitioning update: Hello families, as you are aware we have started transitioning the older children moving up to the kindergarten room next year. So far, the process is going very well and most of the children are showing more confidence in the space. Please feel free to enter the kindergarten room when you are dropping your child at Kindy over the last few months of 2023 and introduce yourself to the kindergarten room Educators. It is very important to familiarise yourself with your child's Educators and the morning Kindergarten room routine and program. Please note some children who have started Junior Kindy room at a young age are very attached to their familiar Educator's and they may need some extra reassurance with their individual transitioning process. Please keep these conversations positive to ensure your child continues to feel comfortable and supported with the changes.

<u>Halloween:</u> Educators and children all had a wonderful day on the 31st of October celebrating Halloween here in Junior Kindy. Children participated in a variety of Halloween focused activities, and of course our favourite part of the day was trick or treat, where we enjoyed some yummy treats.

The dress up costumes were fantastic, so thank you families for sharing in the fun and dressing up your child for the day.

<u>Garden revamp</u>: We are very pleased to announce that Bunnings have kindly donated some plants and seedlings once again this year and continue to be a big support for AWCC gardening revamps. Since planting the new plants, the children have been very helpful in the garden. They particularly enjoy helping their Educators water the garden every day and this in turn provides them the opportunity to observe the progress and growing stages of a variety of plants. Educators love seeing such active little green thumbs in the garden, and we sure do love how all our new seedlings continue getting all that TCL they require.

<u>Wild Rangers:</u> On Friday the 10th of November we enjoyed another visit from the fabulous 'Wild Rangers' wildlife to you show. Madi the presenter gave the children the opportunity to get up very close and learnt facts about 'Bubble gum' the blue tongue lizard, 'Norman' the water dragon, 'Sheldon' the turtle, 'Leroy' the python and 'Cranky' the young crocodile. We also met 'Matilda' the ring-tailed possum and 'Regi' the tawny frog mouth. The show was very interactive and hands-on with the children getting up close to interact and touch the animals. The show provides a wonderful opportunity to learn about and to interact with

some of Australia's wonderful and unique animals.





## Kindergarten Update

#### **Christmas and Graduation Day**

Our End-of-year Christmas Concert is fast approaching, and the kindergarten children have been practising very hard with the new songs we will be performing. We hope that you can make it!

#### Learning the formation and sounds of letters

Throughout the month, the children have also expanded their literacy and numeracy knowledge in our classroom. During collaborative group time, we revised the letters learnt, practised the sound, and brainstormed familiar words beginning with the week's letter. We had so much fun making rocket ships exploring the letter "R" and different types of pizza on the letter "P."

#### **Wild Rangers show**

This month, we had a fantastic show; Madi from Wild Rangers showed us some amazing animals and reptiles. The children learnt interesting facts about these animals, their living conditions, the dangers, what they eat and how they survive in the wild. Madi brought in a large variety of Australian animals for the children to observe and touch with their 'brave and gentle' finger. These included a blue tongue lizard, water dragon, turtle, python, baby crocodile, ring-tailed possum, and tawny frog mouth.

How lucky are our children to have this opportunity to experience close-up encounters with such exquisite Australian creatures!

#### "Going to school."

A new play area was set up in the room, "Going to school." School uniforms from many different local schools are displayed to allow the children to explore and practise putting them on, taking them off, and using them in their play. By providing the children with the resources to role play/pretend play school scenarios, it can help them understand and process the changes that are going to happen, at their own pace, through play with their peers. How cute and grown up they look!


