Parents' Evaluation of Development Status (PEDS):

We also have access to a myriad of pathways and can refer your child to necessary departments for additional help if needed Please hand these to the Educators in your child's room once completed.

We have a second-hand clothing cupboard that we encourage all families to take and add items. This is the big, grey cupboard just before the entry gate. You can see this by tapping the scrolling arrows symbol at the top of the feed and select 'Children Portfolio'. It will show all the posts your child has been tagged in and also their monthly observations. All observations are locked and only parents/guardians can view.

We also encourage families to share posts on OWNA; whether it be a new sibling, a new skill, holiday, special event, cultural celebration, or weekend activity, please share. Children enjoy sharing their home lives, it helps them to connect with others, encourages complex conversation, and provides a positive sense of self when talking about exciting events that are significant to each child.

Happy & Healthy Hints from the AWCC Kitchen

<u>Herbed Honey Meatballs</u>

- 1 kg chicken or beef mince
- 2 Tbs flax seed meal (alt 1 egg)
- 1 teaspoon fresh parsley
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1/2 onion, finely chopped
- 1 teaspoon chicken stock powder
- 3 tablespoons honey
- 1 teaspoon garlic
- 1 cup fresh breadcrumbs
- Mixed grated vegetables carrot, zucchini etc.
- 1/2 tin of gravy mix

Combine all ingredients in a large bowl. Shape mixture into meatballs and gently cook in frying pan. Place in a baking dish and cook in moderate oven for 30 minutes turning once.

Serve with gravy.

At AWCC, this dish is served with creamy mash and steamed veggies.



Junior Kindy Update

Hello Families.

The Junior Kindy children have exhibited a keen fascination with dinosaurs lately, sparking the attention of educators who have actively nurtured this interest through a variety of engaging activities. From simulated fossil finding like paleontologists, to the task of chiseling dinosaurs out of ice cubes, and even delving into the realm of dinosaur exploration within our playdough creations. Each activity has provided a richly immersive experience for the children. By integrating learning with play, these interactive endeavors have proven to be highly effective in facilitating the children's understanding and appreciation of dinosaurs.

At the beginning of February, we had the return of our amazing yoga instructor, Nathan. Nathan joins us at AWCC every second Wednesday to lead our children in the practice of yoga. With years of experience teaching at AWCC, Nathan excels in encouraging active participation among the children. For our first session of 2024 Nathan had many of the old and new children excited to participate. During our yoga sessions, we don't just focus on mastering yoga poses, we also immerse ourselves in the art of chanting. One of our cherished chants is "Go Pala." Yoga serves as a holistic practice beneficial for both the physical and mental well-being of children, fostering a harmonious connection between body and mind.

This month we had a visit from a wonderful local musician, Mattie Barker. Mattie brings his guitar and harmonica and has most of the children up singing and dancing. Mattie's music show has a strong emphasis on the key components of musical harmony (beat, melody & rhythm) and its association to our individual happiness and overall wellbeing.

As you may have seen in the Jr Kindy program many of our once younger children have now moved up to big group time. In Jr Kindy, group time is split up into two separate groups. Mostly the groups are (under 2's) (over 2s"). Group times are a great opportunity to support and further children's learning. Group time is a safe space for children to engage, share in learning experiences, talk together, and collaborate. Group time is also a way to create a sense of belonging and togetherness within the group.

In Jr Kindy we value and appreciate any feedback/ family input you might have towards our program. We love to hear about your children's new interests or if there is something exciting, they might want to share with the group. Sharing these things always is a great way to support your child's sense of belonging in Jr Kindy.
